IN MEMORY OF RETIRED BPD OFFICER STEPHEN SAVO

Bridgeport Borough Administration and Police Department wish to communicate to residents the recent passing of retired Police Officer Stephen Savo. Stephen, 64, passed after an eleven-year battle with ALS. Born in Philadelphia on March 8, 1956, Stephen is the son of Mary (Russo) Savo and the late Louis V. Savo of King of Prussia. He was a graduate of Upper Merion High School, Class of 1974, and LaSalle College with a degree in Business Personnel and Labor Relations. A dispatcher for Whitemarsh Police Department before becoming a police officer for the Borough of Bridgeport for 30 years, from 1981-2011, Stephen served in many capacities within the Bridgeport Police Department (BPD). Stephen was the BPD rangemaster and firearms instructor, ensuring that the other officers were professionally trained and certified on multiple weapons systems. He was a founding member and sniper for the Central Montgomery County Emergency Response Team for 10 years and an active member of the Montgomery County F.O.P. Lodge 14. During Officer Savo's career, he distinguished himself on a multitude of occasions, including an arrest for an armed robbery suspect on January 11th, 1990 and was honored as the BPD Officer of the Year for 1991. He was an avid hunter and fisherman, loved gardening, cooking, the beach, and listening to country music. Most importantly, he was a loving husband and devoted father who enjoyed spending time with his family. Survived by is his wife of 35 years, Anita (Niedzielski) Savo, a son, Christopher, and a daughter, Stephanie; his brothers Michael Savo of King of Prussia, John Savo and his wife, Debbie of Brigantine, NJ, and a sister, Barbara Gordon of Harleysville, his godmother Joan (Russo) Capone, many nieces and nephews, three great-nieces and many cousins. TWILIGHT ON THE RIVER CHANGES VENUES IN 2021

2021 will mark the 3rd year of existence for Twilight on the River - the open air evening market Bridgeport has hosted in Rotondo Riverfront Park in both 2018 and 2019. However. those visiting "Twilight" this year will be in for a change of scenery. In a move that is considered temporary in nature. Twilight on the River will be held at Borough Hall's Town Center Parking Lot in 2021 due to county road construction. Montgomery County recently began construction on the Chester Valley Trail; a biking and walking trail that connects Chester County's Struble Trail to Montgomery County's Schuylkill River Trail. A large portion of this project is located in Bridgeport, as the trail will run alongside of DeKalb Street (Route 202), and the concern of Growing Bridgeport Together (GBT), who operates "Twilight", is that the road construction and traffic will make it difficult for both vendors and visitors to access the Rotondo Riverfront Park location. Both Bridgeport Borough and GBT are hopeful that a change in location not only avoids a potential traffic jam, but also that being situated right on Bridgeport's "Main Street" brings the event better exposure to traffic and visitors. Bridgeport Borough wants to thank its residents and businesses for the patience and cooperation demonstrated throughout the snowstorm that hit town on February 1 and 2. Having over a foot of snow dumped on Bridgeport is a different kind of inconvenience altogether! However, with few exceptions, the community banded together; helping one another dig out of the mess and working with our street crews to coordinate the removal of snow from parking areas. Please remember that our #1 obligation is to make sure that Borough streets and alleys are cleared and safe for travel; this often means that vehicles, driveways and parking spaces are going to get plowed in as a result. There is no other viable alternative. However, once our crews have cleared the streets and municipal lots of snow, their goal is to help residents and businesses whenever they are able. So, after a snowfall, if you are able to coordinate with your neighbors to remove cars from your block temporarily, then contact Borough Hall at 610-272-1811 and we will send a plow to help clear out the on-street parking on your block as they become available. And, as a reminder, on-street parking spaces are located in the Borough right-of-way and do not belong to any one resident or business. People should not take the parking space that you just cleared out, but it does happen. Placing an item in the street, like a beach chair or trash can, in order to reserve your space is not legal. Thank you for your ongoing cooperation and let us hope the snow is over for 2021.
