TRASH AND RECYCLING REMINDERS

Fall Leaf Collection: Public Works will continue collecting fall leaves from curb side until the first major snow of the season. Leaf collection days are Mondays and Fridays, every week.

Bulk Items: All residents may place one (1) bulk item curbside per month for collection on the last Tuesday of the month. These items can include: Furniture, Carpets (must be cut into 3-foot widths, rolled, tied or taped. Only 10 rolls of carpet/ padding per pick up.), Appliances that do not use Freon, Tree limbs or trunks larger than 3" in diameter (Cannot be longer than 36"), Windows, mirrors, glass panels in doors, etc. (Must be taped in a crisscross pattern to prevent breakage.), and Mattresses and box springs (A mattress + box spring is considered one (1) item, so both can be put out together.) All mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic sheeting or bagged prior to putting them out for curbside collection. Please understand that box springs and mattresses that are not wrapped/bagged and fully sealed will not be collected.

Please Note: Bulk pick up is not an opportunity to dispose of multiple items accumulated over a lifetime when you are moving. If you wish to dispose of more than one item, please call J.P. Mascaro at 610-272-2765 and they will arrange a special pick up for you. Multiple bulk items placed at the curb is prohibited without an agreement with Mascaro. This restriction will be strictly enforced.

CHESTER VALLEY TRAIL CONSTRUCTION BEGINS IN BRIDGEPORT

By now, many of you may have noticed the construction taking place back along Ross Road, leading up to the intersection of Fifth Street and DeKalb Street; not to mention the closure of Saulin Boulevard over in Upper Merion Township. This is all a result of the same project – The Chester Valley Trail, a 13 mile stretch of retired railbed being converted into a hiking and biking trail that will connect two larger trail systems when completed: the Struble Trail of Chester County and the Schuylkill River Trail of Montgomery County. Once construction of the paved trail along Ross Road has been completed, trail construction will move to DeKalb Street, as the Chester Valley Trail will run parallel to DeKalb heading toward Norristown, until it ultimately crosses the Schuylkill River Bridge, replacing one of the two southbound lanes on the bridge currently dedicated to traffic. In addition to the construction of the trail along DeKalb, this project also involves the reconstruction and realignment of the intersection at Front Street and DeKalb Street. The estimated completion time for this project is some time late in 2022; therefore, residents should plan on having a construction presence along the DeKalb corridor for the next twelve months. Bridgeport Borough administration and police will keep residents informed on the news and updates regarding any impacts to traffic or the overall welfare of the community resultant from this project, so please periodically check our official Bridgeport Borough website and Facebook pages for the latest!
